

Age Group: 3-5 years


You will need: Clear, plastic cup **Construction paper** Scissors Glue **Potting soil** Radish seeds Ruler Water

Small plate

Experiment of the Month:

1. Have an adult poke a hole in the bottom of the cup.

- 2. Decorate your cup with a nose, mouth and eyes cut from construction paper.
- 3. Fill the cup 34 full with soil and add 4 radish seeds, covered with ½ inch of soil.
- 4. Water the seeds and put your Radish Kid on a small plate in a sunny place..
- 5. Check your Radish Kid daily to watch the "hair" grow and keep the soil moist.
- 6. In a few weeks, a radish root will grow in the soil. If you transplant it outdoors, it will grow big enough to eat!
